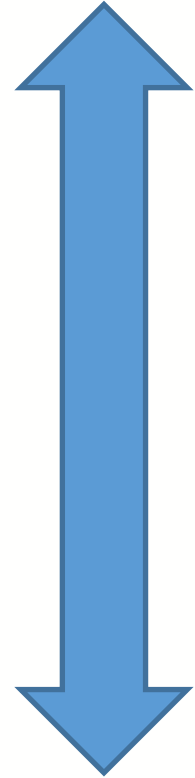

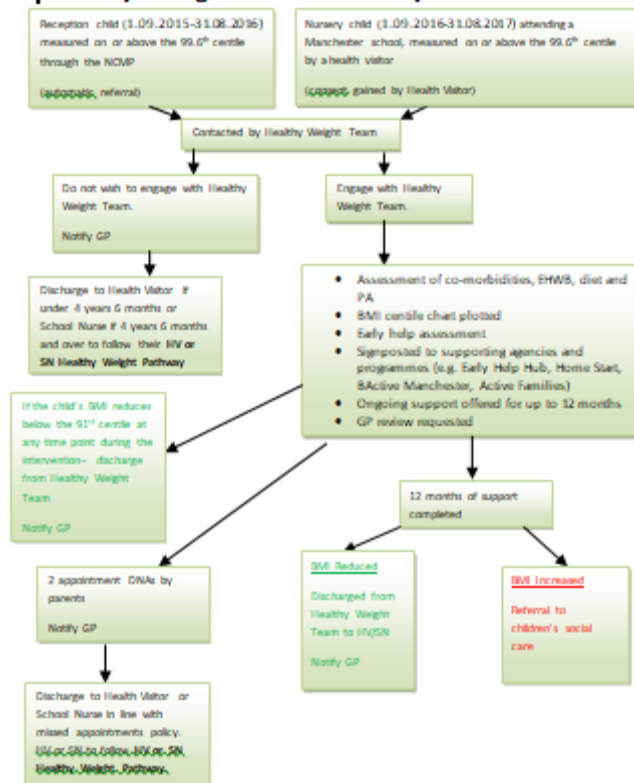

Reception child (1.09.2015-
31.08.2016) measured on or above
the 99.6th centile through the NCMP
(automatic referral)

Nursery child (1.09.2016-31.08.2017)
attending a Manchester school, measured on
or above the 99.6th centile by a health visitor
(consent gained by Health Visitor)

Assessment of co-morbidities,
EHWB, diet and PA

months

Weight Pathway.**
